



ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Radiologic Technology (Radiography) is the use of high-tech imaging equipment to assist physicians in diagnosing illness and trauma. Radiographers (also known as Radiologic Technologists or X-Ray Technologists) may use X-Ray technology on specific parts of the body.

City College's Associate of Science in Radiologic Technology is a 22-month program that combines classroom, lab, and clinical practice components, providing students with the most integrated curriculum and training. The program is designed to prepare students to meet the requirements necessary to apply for the written examination given by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) and to function as entry-level radiographers, with the potential to advance in other modalities.

Radiographers have extensive direct patient contact, which is why the program focuses on knowledge of radiation protection as well as the positioning of anatomical structures on a radiograph. Students also gain experience evaluating and examining radiographs as well as practice discretion and conclusions in the performance of medical imaging procedures.
