On February 25, 2019, Allied Health students on the Hollywood campus had a unique opportunity at a Lunch and Learn with **Gerald Jones**, of **Pediatric Associates of South Florida**.

Mr. Jones told the students that he had a background in business and began as a business manager. From there he became a certified coder, and eventually he worked his way up to his current position running a pediatric practice. He encouraged students to believe in themselves. He said that he prefers to hire people with no experience so that he can mold them into what he needs them to be.

He talked about the challenges that come from running a pediatric practice—as we might expect, parents are paying close attention. He gave details that most of us wouldn't know about the way that billing happens during a woman's pregnancy. Most of the money isn't paid to the doctor's office until the woman has had the baby, so customer service is vital. It's important that the pregnant woman not switch to a different practice.

He talked about the front desk being the face of the practice and how important the students will be in their first jobs as the ones with the first interactions with patients.

On March 9, 2019, all of the EMS students from the Hollywood campus of City College participated in the **Fight for Air Climb** in Miami. What's more, the Hollywood team was one of the top ten fundraising teams for the March 9 Fight for Air Climb event. Twenty Hollywood students and 2 instructors from the Hollywood campus participated, along with faculty and students from the Ft. Lauderdale campus.

Some of the team members made an extra effort. Hollywood campus Instructor **Peter Berger** and Hollywood student **Rafael Franceschini** made the climb of 38 flights of stairs in 50 pounds of gear; Hollywood student **David Silva** made the climb in a 100 pound weight vest.

Durnell James, a Hollywood student, was the fastest male finisher, making the climb in 7 minutes and 46 seconds. **Erika Montanez**, another Hollywood student, was the fastest female, finishing in just

under 8 minutes.

The team has raised over \$4,000 so far. Climb Miami broke all sorts of records for this event, which is held across the country.

But more important than the money raised was the teambuilding that the event made possible. Team members encouraged each other and helped each other to the top of the building. The whole campus pitched in to pledge money and to root for the success of the team.

Navigating Your Financial Future



- Review a complete listing of your federal student loan debt at the National Student Loan Data System, https://nslds.ed.gov/nslds/nslds_SA/
You will need your FSA ID and password to log in to your account
- Review repayment plans and select one that best meets your current financial situation at StudentAid.ed.gov
- Update your personal contact information with the servicer
- Prepare for repayment by setting up automatic withdrawals and creating a realistic budget to stay on track with payments
