

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Diagnostic Medical Sonography (ultrasound) is medical imaging that uses non-ionizing ultrasound to generate 2D and 3D images of organs, tissues and blood flow. Sonographers (Ultrasound Technologists) use sound waves across specific parts of the body to provide clinical information to assist physicians in the diagnosis and treatment of patients. The field of Sonography has many areas of specialization, including obstetrics/gynecology, abdomen, echocardiography, vascular, breast and pediatric sonography.

City College's Associate of Science in Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program focuses on the necessary skills entry-level Sonographers need to possess to work within a medical team, alongside physicians, nurses and other healthcare professionals. The program also trains students to possess a high level of critical thinking and decision-making skills as they work directly with patients and must be both technically competent as well as compassionate.

Two Tracks Available:

- **Abdomen & OB/GYN (General)**
- **Echocardiography & Vascular**

Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program is a 22-month course of study, designed to prepare students in the cognitive (knowledge), psychomotor (skills) and affective (behavior) learning domains.

The program combines classroom, lab and clinical practice components providing students with a well-rounded curriculum and training in sonography, covering all four modalities: abdominal, gynecology/obstetrics, as well as vascular and cardiac sonography. Clinical rotations are in areas specific to the student's respective track of study.
